

Sept 2014 Newsletter

GCDAC are pleased to report that the construction of our River pathway and fishing stands project will begin on week commencing

15th September and should take approximately 3 weeks to complete.

This project has taken 3 years to bring to light, a number of legal processes were required to acquire the fishing rights, access and permission from the Church of Ireland Vestry. The stretch of river can be accessed by the rear of the Glenaidan Centre. The project will include the river pathway which will start behind the Glenaidan Centre and stop at St Aidan's Church Hall.

Three fishing stands will be erected in this area, two standard and one disabled fishing stand. The Club hope that this new facility will encourage our local community young and old to use the public walkway, become involved in the sport of angling and support the Club conservation activities. Over the next few years we intend to improve on those facilities and put Glenavy firmly back in the spotlight as an area of natural beauty and a River that is free from pollution. This project has been funded by Lagan Rural Partnership (DARD) and Lisburn City Council. A plan is attached.

During a recent tree survey, the trees on the River bank at the site of the project were recorded and are now on a monitoring programme, extensive tree surgery was carried out where required. The Club **urgently** need volunteers to help clear



some of the over growth around the Riverbank after the Construction work has been carried out. The tree surgery has also left untidy debris around the pathway, the Club also intend to have a River clean up to remove dumping from the River in the Autumn. So if you have any time to spare please come forward and lend your support, the team will be grateful.

At the end of June a pollution incident killed **400** fish in the Glenavy River.

The Club would like to thank all those who came forward and expressed their support. The Club restocking programme has been running for over 5 years and sadly, most of the trout that were killed were mature stock that we had been nurturing for some time. This has come as a setback to the Club and we have therefore contacted our local MP's to fight for tougher fines, we will not tolerate further pollution. The NIEA are aware of the pollution incident and their spokesperson advised us that the agricultural source will be prosecuted in due course.

The Club is asking our members to be vigilant and let us know if and when dumping has occurred in the river. Every year working parties from the Club remove dozens of plastic bags and household debris. Last year a mattress, swings and slides were also found dumped in the River. This causes horrendous difficulties for the wildlife of the River.
